Who's Your One

Acts 8: 26-40 (pew Bible pg. 917)

In Acts 1:8 Jesus said, "But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth."

This promise of Jesus is also His commission: power for a purpose. The promise of Christ is that He will send His Holy Spirit to empower us for the mission to which He has called us. God's power for God's people for God's purpose. That is what we see throughout the book of Acts. We first met Philip in Acts 6. He is one of the seven godly men assigned the humble task of caring for widows. Philip is a Spirit-filled servant within the Jerusalem church. When persecution scatters the believers, Luke records the account of Philip used by God as a missions pioneer – taking the gospel across cultural and racial lines to reach the hated people of Samaria (Acts 8:5-25).

God used Philip to reach a whole people group. In today's passage we see God use Philip to reach just one man. Today we see the sovereign hand of God orchestrating, the Spirit of God leading, the Spirit-filled man of God obeying, the Word of God revealing Christ, and the kingdom of God growing. All of this happens one person at a time. Using Philip's encounter with the Ethiopian as our foundation, we consider two questions today: First, who's your one? Second, how is God at work drawing that person to Christ?

The sovereign hand of God is <i>orchestrating</i> our evangelistic encounters.
The Spirit of God is <i>leading</i> those involved in these encounters.
Spirit-filled people who are <i>obeying</i> see these evangelistic encounters unfold.
Gospel conversations lead to conversions as the Word of God is <i>revealing</i> Christ.
Through these gospel encounters the Kingdom of God is <i>growing</i> .
