Forgiven and Free Acts 13: 13-41 (pew Bible pg. 921-922)

Over 700 years before the birth of Jesus, Isaiah foretold of his coming and his ministry: "*The Spirit of the Lord GOD is upon me, because the LORD has anointed me to bring good news to the poor; he has sent me to bind up the brokenhearted, to proclaim liberty to the captives, and the opening of the prison to those who are bound;*" (Is 61:1). Jesus quoted these verses at the beginning of his ministry and declared that he was the fulfillment of them: "*Today this Scripture has been fulfilled in your hearing.*" (Lk 4:21)

In today's passage, Luke gives us the first sermon of Paul recorded in the book of Acts. It has as its central theme the same message as Isaiah and Jesus, forgiveness and freedom: "Let it be known to you therefore, brothers, that through this man forgiveness of sins is proclaimed to you, and by him everyone who believes is freed from everything from which you could not be freed by the law of Moses." (Acts 13:38–39)

No matter how familiar with the Bible you are or how religious you think you may be (like the Jews Paul was speaking to), apart from faith in Jesus you are still in bondage to your sin and guilt. If you are a follower of Christ, do you see everything through the lens of God's activity in human history? Can you explain to others the good news of Jesus using the Bible? The good news of Jesus is the point of history, the answer to your greatest need, and the message of your mission.
