# Sermon Notes

### Great Power, Great Grace, A Great Church Acts 4: 32-37

Consecutive Expository Preaching. That is the model and method we seek to follow here at Westwood for our preaching/teaching ministry. This means we preach chapter by chapter and verse by verse through books of the Bible on Sunday mornings, allowing the text to dictate the direction of our teaching, and allowing the primary focus of the passage be the primary focus of the sermon. Christopher Ash says preaching this way "gives God the microphone".

I mention this because I believe God has providentially chosen today's passage in Acts as our starting point for 2019. Any preacher looking for a sermon text for the first message of the New Year would be hard pressed to find a better passage than where we find ourselves today in our study of Acts.

The Book of Acts records for us the birth and growth of the early church. Much of Luke's focus in Acts is on the expansion of the church; how Spirit-filled believers take the gospel into the world. But today we see the gospel at work *inside* the church. Through the writing of Luke, God gives us an in-depth look into the heart and soul of this Spirit-filled church. *Now the full number of those who believed were of one heart and soul* (Acts 4:32). What we see is unity. This Spirit-filled fellowship - this gospel unity - is the focus of our passage.

Westwood, today God shows us what will happen when we are a church bound together and unified through:

### **Shared Belief:**

The gospel received and believed binds believers together in unity (Acts 4:32a)

#### Changed Perspective:

The gospel message changes our perspective on possessions and people (Acts 4:32b)

#### **Resurrection Power:**

The gospel empowers us to boldly declare and display the message of grace (Acts 4:33)

#### **Great Generosity:**

The gospel of grace creates people who are sensitive to the needs of others and generous to meet those needs. (Acts 4:34-35)
