### **The Gospel Breaks Through the Wall of Prejudice**

Acts 9:32 – 10:33 (pew Bible pgs. 918-919)

The main character in the book of Acts is Jesus. He is the message in every sermon. His Spirit is the one leading and empowering the church. Jesus is the one that is healing, saving, and transforming the world. *“This Jesus God raised up, and of that we all are witnesses. Let all the house of Israel therefore know for certain that God has made him both Lord and Christ, this Jesus whom you crucified.”* (Acts 2:32 & 36)

While Jesus is the main character, two men stand front and center as the dominant characters in Acts: Peter and Paul. Peter is the key leader in the first half of Acts. Paul takes the spot light in the remainder of the book. Saul (Paul) has been the focus of first part of Acts 9, but in today’s text Peter is again the central figure. Peter has been God’s primary spokesman as the gospel has spread throughout Jerusalem and Judea (Acts 2-ff). He was there in Samaria when the Holy Spirit was given to the Samaritans after they received the gospel message of Philip (Acts 8). Now Peter will again be front and center as the gospel mission turns to the Gentiles. The events in Acts 10 are a major turning point in the growth of Christianity. Today we see God do amazing works *through* Peter. More importantly we see God do an amazing work *in* Peter. Both were necessary before the gospel could go forth to the nations in Acts. Both are still necessary today if we are to see the gospel break through the walls of prejudice in our community.
