Sermon Notes

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Marks of a Disciple-Maker Acts 18:1 – 19:10 (pew Bible pgs. 927-928)

This passage in Acts provides an overview of the end of Paul's second missionary journey prior to returning to Antioch. This episode in Luke's recount includes a few key characters in addition to Paul. As the drama unfolds, we can see certain marks that are evident in the lives of those who are about the work of strengthening believers and churches in Christ and in the gospel. As we look at these 10 marks together, let's be faithful to see if they are marks in our own lives as well.
