"And So We Came to Rome"

Acts 28:11-31 (pew Bible pgs. 937-938)

Most of us like resolution. We want our stories, books and movies to reach the end all tidied up, with the villain vanquished, the hero winning, and everyone living happily ever after. But if you are a Star Wars fan, you know this is not the case in galaxy far, far away. Since 1977, episode after episode, followers of the force have been left to wonder what comes next. How will the ongoing conflict between the Jedi and the Sith come to an end? (to be continued...)

As we come to the end of Acts, we find no happy-ever-after ending. Tony Merida says, "If you like complete closure and prefer happily-ever-after conclusions, then you might be disappointed with the ending of Acts." Acts ends with a lot of loose ends. We don't know how Paul's imprisonment ends. We don't know what happened with his appeal to Caesar. We don't know how long he stayed in Rome. We don't know when and how he ultimately died. What we do find at the end Acts is an ongoing story, a big fat 'to be continued'.

Why? Because Luke isn't giving us the story of Paul or Peter or the Apostles. Acts describes the ongoing work of the Lord Jesus accomplished by the Spirit. It is about the growth of God's kingdom and the unhindered growth of the gospel.

Today we see Paul and traveling companions finally come to Rome. But Rome is not the end of Paul's mission, because Rome is not the end of Christ's commission. We are living in the continuation of that story. As we see Paul reach Rome, we find timeless truths that can be applied to our lives as we live out the gospel story.

None of us are the Apostle Paul, but like Paul, when we live in the reality that we are saved by grace, commissioned by Christ, sustained for a purpose, and assured of victory in the end......

We can see every circumstance of our lives as a gospel opportunity.

We should see the whole of God's word as the gospel story.

We can rest in the reality of the unhindered growth of God's kingdom.
