

Sermon Notes

My Humble Prayer and Confident Hope

Psalm 119:17-24

[17] Deal bountifully with your servant, that I may live and keep your word. [18] Open my eyes, that I may behold wondrous things out of your law. [19] I am a sojourner on the earth; hide not your commandments from me! [20] My soul is consumed with longing for your rules at all times. [21] You rebuke the insolent, accursed ones, who wander from your commandments. [22] Take away from me scorn and contempt, for I have kept your testimonies. [23] Even though princes sit plotting against me, your servant will meditate on your statutes. [24] Your testimonies are my delight; they are my counselors. (Psalm 119:17–24, Gimel)

As a faithful follower of Jesus, like our Lord, it is inevitable that you will face opposition, ridicule, criticism as you walk with him. After all, the Psalmist says, you are "a sojourner on this earth" (v19). When that happens, these verses are a God-given guide. In fact, the Bible itself can become your counselor (v24), but only if you have the eyes to see the "wonderous things" (v18) in the Scriptures. So, the Psalmist prays that God will open his eyes to see these truths. Jesus is our "Wonderful Counselor" (Isaiah 9:6), and it is in the pages of his Word that we find his wonderful counsel and comfort. All that we need for our sojourn in this place, all that we need to 'live and keep his word" while we are here (v17) is found in Christ. This section of Psalm 119 is a humble prayer and a confident statement of faith.

The Humble Servant's Prayer: "As I walk in this world, I ask you to give me everything I need to live for you". (Psalm 119:17-20)

The Hurting Servant's Confidence: As I walk in obedience in the face of persecution, I can trust God to handle the opposition and guide my steps. (Psalm 119:21-24)
