### **Sermon Notes**

#### The Wilderness Paradox

Hosea 2: 1-23 (pew Bible pgs. 751-752)

During four days in mid-August of 1969, approximately 400,000 people gathered at Max Yasgur's dairy farm near White Lake, New York for the Woodstock Music and Art Fair for An Aquarian Exposition: 3 Days of Peace & Music. "People, mostly young, tired of the pompous cliches and worn out admonitions of their parents, decided that with the dawning of the Age of Aquarius, they would no longer need the hegemony's sanctions to survive in life." The 1960s counterculture wanted to usher in a new age defined by peace and love, and threw off the materialistic, militaristic, self-interested, and sexually repressed culture of their parents.

Joni Mitchell portrayed the sentiment in her song, Woodstock, commemorating the event. In the final verse of the song, she laments, "We are stardust. We are golden. We are caught in the devil's bargain. And we got to get ourselves back to the garden." This garden reference pointed back to the paradise of the Garden of Eden. Mitchell's lyrics rightly recognize there is something wrong with this world. However, her solution assumes we can fix our world ourselves. The direction she sends us is further into Satan's lie. And the destination she sees as an angel forever blocks paradise with a flaming sword.

Though it appears to be a contradiction, the road back to paradise is not beautiful and lush. It's not an easy road of pleasure and worldly peace - the path through a wilderness where suffering is the norm and striving marks the day. Not laid out by man, but Jesus, the God-man, leads the way through this wilderness paradox.
