Sermon Notes

The Sum of Your Word is Truth, Therefore.....

Psalm 119: 145-160 [Qoph] (pew Bible pgs. 515-516)

Westwood's Statement of Faith says, "The Holy Bible was written by men divinely inspired and is God's revelation of Himself to man. It is a perfect treasure of divine instruction. It has God for its author, salvation for its end, and truth, without any mixture of error, for its matter. Therefore, all Scripture is totally true and trustworthy. It reveals the principles by which God judges us, and therefore is, and will remain to the end of the world, the true center of Christian union, and the supreme standard by which all human conduct, creeds, and religious opinions should be tried. All Scripture is a testimony to Christ, who is Himself the focus of divine revelation." (Baptist Faith and Message 2000)

It is important for us to know, understand, and apply what we believe. What we believe determines what we value, and what we value demonstrates how we live. What we believe about God matters, and what we believe about his Word matters.

Our church's doctrinal statement encapsulates what we have been seeing in Psalm 119, and what today's passage declares: *The sum of your word is truth, and every one of your righteous rules endures forever*. (Ps. 119:160) Today we will consider the doctrinal truth that God's Word is inspired, it is authoritative, it is inerrant, and it is eternal. We will then consider what this text tells us about the huge implications and applications of these truths in our daily lives.
