Sermon Notes

First Love: Jesus' Assessment of Our Affections

Revelation 2: 1-8

Revelation shows us that Jesus will come back one day to close out history. But Revelation also shows us that Christ regularly comes to his church now – he walks among us and speaks to us both to encourage us and judge us. This is what we see today as we begin our study of Jesus' letters to his seven churches.

Today we see a church that was doctrinally sound and had a keen sense of what was right and wrong. They knew the difference between the truth of God's Word and false teaching. They sought to do good works in the community around them, they ferociously defended the glory of Christ's name above all other names, and they staunchly defended against moral compromise. They patiently endured hardship and stood up against opposition. On many fronts, this sounds like a perfectly healthy church. We would hope Jesus could say the same about us.

Yet for all that the church in Ephesus was doing well, Jesus had one criticism, and it is a huge problem. Jesus himself said to them, "But I have this against you, that you have abandoned the love you had at first." (Revelation 2:4) Outwardly things looked great, but the One with "eyes like a flame of fire" (Rev 1:14) saw right through their business and saw the reality of their hearts - they had lost their passion for Jesus, their passion for the gospel. A passionate love for Christ leads us to love those outside and seek to win them. This they have lost. It's not like they had misplaced it and couldn't find it; they had left it; they had walked away from it. Other things had distracted them. Other interests and pursuits had captured their hearts. They were merely going through the religious motions.

Jesus has a holy passion for his church, for Westwood. He has a jealous love for us. Yes, he wants our obedience and doctrinal fidelity, he wants us to work hard for him and patiently endure. But he wants more. He demands more. He wants our love. In his grace he points out where this passion is missing, and he offers us a way back.
