Tough Love for A Tepid Church

Revelation 3: 14-22

"I will spit you out of my mouth....you are wretched, pitiable, poor, blind and naked." These are hard words. These are not the words anyone wants to hear spoken to them from Christ. Yet this is Jesus' strong rebuke for the church in Laodicea. That church was like the lukewarm nauseating drinking water the city was infamous for. They were, like their city, satisfied, self-sufficient and complacent. The letter to the Laodiceans is the strongest of the seven letters and is perhaps the most relevant to the current condition of the modern western church. John Stott wrote, "Perhaps none of the seven letters is more appropriate to the 21st century church than this one. It describes vividly the respectable, sentimental, nominal, skin-deep religiosity which is so widespread among us today. Our Christianity is flabby and anemic. We appear to have taken a lukewarm bath of religion."

Even in Jesus' strong words of condemnation there is an offer of grace, the offer of repentance and an invitation to a restored relationship and deep fellowship. He / she who "has an ear needs to hear" what the Lord Jesus has to say to us about his love – his gracious, corrective, reviving tough love.
