Sermon Notes

Living in Light of the End

1 Thessalonians 5:1-11

This morning we are taking a brief departure from our study through the book of Revelation, but we will continue to consider what Scripture has to say about the end to which our sovereign Lord is bringing all of history. In his first letter to the Thessalonians, Paul is compelled to offer insight into the curiosity, questions, and confusion of the believers in that city as to what all that end entails. The Apostle responds not by offering further details in an effort to scratch their curious itch, but instead by offering encouragement concerning how the certainty of the coming Day of the Lord should affect the lives of believers in the here and now. Just like for us in our day, the present circumstances for those believers caused them to long for that day, which is a good thing, and they longed to know how all the pieces fit together. And like believers today, they had a choice to make. Would they embrace the façade of peace offered by the surrounding culture, or would they press on in obedience and faith by resting in the certainty (although lack of complete understanding) of God's promises for then, even if it resulted in suffering in the present?

What does it actually look like for the believer to dress him or herself in the armor that Paul urges us to wear? What do we have to believe about God and the gospel in order to live in these ways?
