The Characters Involved in this Terrible Scene

The fallen angel – Abaddon the destroyer

The evil hordes – given power to hurt but not to kill

The unsealed earth-dwellers – tormented for a time

Four unbound angels – prepared for the hour

The demonic army – two hundred million unleashed to kill

The Holy God – absolutely sovereign and just in his punishment of evil

The Carnage Released on Mankind

Tormented – seeking death but unable to find it

Slaughtered - cumulative calamity from plague after plague

The Callused Hearts of the Unrepentant

Unrepentant survivors still in love with their idols

Unrepentant survivors still in love with their immorality

Applications:

Safe if sealed: Flee to Christ, the only place of safety

Don't envy the worldly or their ways: what we see in Rev 9 is coming

Soft hearts characterize the saints: be quick to repent

Never doubt the sovereign hand of God controlling all things – including Satan

Redeem the time and tears of this world: evangelize and invite
