**The Beasts of Revelation 13: The Call to Endurance & Wisdom** Revelation 13 (pew Bible pg. 1035)

In chapter 12 of Revelation, we see a picture of a great dragon who wages war on God's people. Although he is a defeated foe, for "he knows his time is short" (12:12), his wrath is kindled as he rages and deceives. At the end of chapter 12, we are offered a picture of him standing on the sand of the sea. In chapter 13, we see two new characters introduced that arise from the sea to join him in his nefarious cause. While this thirteenth chapter (once again) includes a high degree of mystery surrounding the identity of these two new characters (beasts, as they are called), as well as the concept of the beast's name and its association with the numerical value of 666, the central message of this chapter is framed by two specific statements to John's audience. The first statement is offered after a vivid description of the first beast that calls for "endurance and faith of the saints" (13:10c). The second is offered just after the description of the second beast and within the context of aligning its name with "the number of a man," or 666, in exhorting believers to attain and exercise wisdom. Though we are immediately prone to want to try to once again seek to alleviate the mystery found within this passage, we must understand the highly theological nature of this passage, as well as its place within the entirety of the biblical narrative. This will help us to pursue both endurance and wisdom by keeping our eyes fixed not on a puzzle to figure out, but on the One who has conquered and reigns eternally as Lord and King!

How does this passage present to us the true nature of the deception of our enemy? How does it illustrate the need for us to pursue wisdom and discernment?
