Sermon Notes

Christian Wives: The Beauty & Power of Submissiveness

Ephesians 5:22, Colossians 3:18, I Peter 2:13-3:6

One of the results of being Spirit-filled is submission. Submission to Christ and to one another is a demonstration of reverence to Christ, acknowledgment of God-ordained structures of authority, and recognition of the Imago Dei (Image of God) in our fellow human beings. In each picture of submission in Ephesians, Paul constantly keeps the focus on Christ.

This is what makes Christian submissiveness such an oddity in this world. It is an expression of light in the darkness; a demonstration of the Lordship of Christ over all things, and a picture of what it will look like when his kingdom comes and his will is done on earth as it is in heaven. The Spirit empowers us to submit by enabling us to see beyond the earthly authorities to the One who stands above all – the Lord Jesus Christ.

In our dark culture, there is no better platform, no more odd and countercultural demonstration of the gospel light than Christian marriage. Christian marriage is a demonstration of the Designer's plan for His Church and, ultimately, the new creation. The Biblical model of marriage opens up a window for the world to behold the beauty of the gospel. Christian marriage is a demonstration of the humble, submissive, self-sacrificing love of Christ. Last week we looked at the roles and responsibilities of husbands, who are called to "love your wives as Christ loved the church." Today our focus is on Christian wives. Paul bookends this section on marriage with the wife's role and responsibility. There is no more odd and countercultural demonstration of this gospel light than the wife's Spirit-empowered submission to her husband. Barbara Hughes says, "When we (Christian wives) submit to our spouses, we are once again agreeing with God that His beautiful ordered plan is worth obeying and the mystery worth preserving. By so doing we once again acknowledge that Jesus is Lord."
