### Sermon Notes

# The Promised King in the Book of Ruth Ruth 3: Hope, Risk, Integrity, & the Hidden Hand of God

Sometimes it seems God has forgotten his 'hesed' love. We see our circumstances through the lens of emotion rather than faith and conclude that God's covenant faithfulness has been set aside for a time. We've seen this in the story of Naomi and Ruth. Yet, as this story continues to unfold, we see in Ruth and Boaz and Naomi the reality that God will never leave or forsake his own (Hebrews 13:5), and he will be faithful to provide all we need and more as we trust in him (Psalm 37:3-4). God works through the bitter and the sweet to bring this about.

This provision always comes within the context of God's sovereign purposes. And those plans, more often than not, are worked out and accomplished through the mysterious combination of God's providential care and guidance along with our praying, waiting, and working. This is what we see unfolding in Ruth, especially in chapter three.

In the third chapter of Ruth, we see a change in Naomi. God has shown himself a faithful provider. Through God's kindness, Ruth's initiative and hard work, and Boaz's generosity, Naomi's emptiness and negativity have been reversed. Now we find her hoping and planning – some would say scheming – for Ruth to find a husband and all the security and provision that comes with that. The threshing floor plan is filled with unfamiliar cultural practices and contextual nuance. The narrative is filled with words that can have multiple meanings and not-so-subtle sexual undertones. The scene is provocative. On a practical level, it seems to be a risky scheme. On a much deeper level, we see the worthy character of Ruth and Boaz. Their integrity and holiness are apparent as we see the hidden hand of God governing actions, reactions, and responses that accomplish his good plans.
