Sermon Notes

The Resurrection Changes Everything

John 20:19-28

In his book The Reason for God, Pastor Tim Keller writes, "If Jesus rose from the dead, you have to accept all He said; if He didn't rise from the dead, then why worry about anything He said.....If Jesus rose from the dead that changes everything."

The point of this message is not to convince you that Jesus is alive, that he is risen from the dead. Scripture declares that truth, eyewitnesses declare it, history confirms it, and the changed lives of many in this room witness to it. The point of this message is to declare that Jesus is risen. That truth can change the lives of those living with fear and doubt. That truth changes everything, and it demands a decision from each of us.

The Resurrection Changes the Lives of Those Living in Fear

On the evening of that day, the first day of the week, the doors being locked where the disciples were for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said to them, "Peace be with you." When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples were glad when they saw the Lord. John 20:19–20

The Resurrection Changes the Lives of Those Living with Doubt

Eight days later, his disciples were inside again, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were locked, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here, and see my hands; and put out your hand and place it in my side. Do not disbelieve, but believe." Thomas answered him, "My Lord and my God!" John 20:26–28

The Resurrection Changes the Lives of Those Who Make Jesus Their King

This Jesus God raised up, and of that we all are witnesses. Let all the house of Israel therefore know for certain that God has made him both Lord and Christ, this Jesus whom you crucified.
