The Lord's Rejection of Saul: Conflicted, Convicted, and Compelled 1 Samuel 15

The Command of God That Conflicts Us (1 Samuel 15:1-3)

Sometimes what we see in the Bible is not only hard to understand, it is difficult to even read! It can be offensive, repulsive, or even embarrassing. "How could a loving God do that?" is a common response to a passage like we see today. In the judgment of many "that God is a moral monster" and the basis of their rejection of Christianity. God's command to Saul to utterly destroy the Amalekites is a difficult passage. Yet when we see this command in the context of the complete Biblical story, we see displayed the complete character of God and the full spectrum of his redemptive purposes. The just wrath of God should give us pause because judgment is what we all deserve. But when God's wrath is seen in the full glory of the gospel where God's justice and mercy meet at the cross of Christ, it should lead us to thankful praise and Spirit-empowered evangelism.

The Sin of Saul That Convicts Us (1 Samuel 15:4-31)

The story of Saul is, at the human level, one of tragedy. At the heart of this tragedy is human sinfulness. Not just Saul's sin, but the sin of us all. Various elements such as pride, misplaced fear, self-will, selfishness, all these and more reveal the components of sin. But when it's boiled down to its essence, Saul's sin is disobedience - the willful rejection of God's word. Even when given clear instructions from God, Saul chooses to do what he wants instead. God's response couldn't be clearer: *"Has the LORD as great delight in burnt offerings and sacrifices, as in obeying the voice of the LORD? Behold, to obey is better than sacrifice, and to listen than the fat of rams. (1 Sam 15:22)* Saul's sin should convict us of our own sin that seeks our will and way more than God's. That Spirit-led conviction will lead us to godly sorrow, genuine repentance and the joy of God's forgiveness (2 Cor 7:10).

The Delight of God That Compels Us (1 Samuel 15: 22-23)

God is a complex emotional being. But his emotions are not like ours, even though the terms used also describe human emotions. 1 Samuel 15 records some of God's emotional complexity and does so without compromising any component of God's character. The term "regret" ('repent" in the KJV) is used three times in the chapter in reference to God's decision to choose Saul as Israel's king. The word "delight" is also used to describe God's response to our faithful obedience. "The astonishing thing is that God so enters into his involvement with his creation, in particular humanity, and even more particularly with his people, that their failures [and successes] affect him." Therefore, we should be compelled to avoid at all costs that which sorrows him and seek at all costs that which delights him.
