Sermon Notes

Faithful and Fleeing?

1 Samuel 19-20

As we work our way through 1 and 2 Samuel, we come to a desperate and discouraging season in David's life. The tension between Saul, the rejected king (16:1) and David, God's anointed king (16:12-13), reaches an epic level in the closing chapters of 1 Samuel. The Hebrew word messiah means "anointed one," so David is the "messiah" of Israel at this time. And as Psalm 2 declares, one of the rulers of the world is taking his stand "against the Lord and against his anointed".

David is successfully carrying out his responsibilities, he is humbly obeying his superiors, he is esteemed by those who observe his life, but the more David succeeds and the more faithful he is, the greater Saul's jealousy and hatred rages against God's anointed and the more difficult David's life becomes.

Preachers and proponents of the prosperity gospel will have a difficult time making sense of David's life as it is presented in this section of 1 Samuel. David himself has a difficult time making sense of his life and circumstances. We too, are often confused and afraid, having a difficult time making sense of our lives and circumstances.

First, We Need to See the Reality of Three Bedrock Truths for Our Faith: (Romans 8:28-30)

God's gracious calling God's eternal promises God's consistent protection

Faithful, but facing open hostility

Faithful, but having to flee for your life

Faithful, but relentlessly pursued

In David's Life We See the Reality That Our Faith Can Be Strengthened As We See God Protecting Us. (1 Samuel 19)

> In David And Jonathan's Lives We See the Reality That Our Faith is Sustained by God's Covenant Love For Us. (1 Samuel 20)

Covenant love that clarifies our confusion Covenant love that solidifies our future

Covenant love that supersedes our personal ambitions

Covenant love that establishes our peace
