

Sermon Notes

God's King & Man's Politics 2 Samuel 2:1-32

Frequently in the Psalms David declares to God *"I will wait for you"* and testifies to others *"For God alone my soul waits"*. Waiting on God is a distinguishing characteristic of David. In 2 Samuel 2, after waiting many years (commentators say between 15-20), David seems to finally have a clear path to the throne he was promised. Yet rather than presumptively rushing in, David prayerfully and patiently waits for God's direction. When that direction is clear, he graciously and wisely moves forward. In this passage, David will be publicly declared king over the southern tribe of Israel, and even in this limited capacity, he demonstrates kingly characteristics like kindness, sensitivity, and savvy.

In stark contrast to David, we also see in this chapter the consequences of politics and power-hungry ambition. David will reign over a united Israel, but that is still a few years away, and the journey there will be filled with violence, betrayal, and heartache. 2 Samuel 2 is a foretaste of that difficulty.

In this chapter, we can see how we wait, how politics and selfish ambition divide us, and how a heart for God's kingdom keeps us focused.
