### God's Kingdom & Man's Ambitions

2 Samuel 3

In our current Life Group study (*The Gospel* by Ray Ortland), we recently saw how the world's culture leads and governs by a different set of standards (different beatitudes) than those taught by King Jesus. These worldly 'beatitudes' include:

Blessed are the entitled, for they get their way.

Blessed are the pushy, for they win.

Blessed are the vengeful, for they will be feared.

Blessed are the winners, for they get their way.

After Saul's death, David continues to exemplify patient submission to God, prayerful dependence on God's direction, and grace towards those who could be considered his enemies. This stands in stark contrast to the rival regime of Abner and Ish-bosheth, who refuse to accept God's decreed will to have David as Israel's king.

In 2 Samuel 3, man's politics, pragmatism, personal ambition, and revenge seem to rule the day. Even David resorts to problematic policies that will have tragic consequences. Yet despite all these flaws and failures, God is at work fulfilling his purposes. The story of David and his reign continues to point us to the righteous King who is to come – the promised son of David, our Lord Jesus Christ.

Personal ambition & cultural compromise: recipe for division today and future devastation (3:1-11)

Politics, rivalry & revenge: worldly methods and motivations that do not further the kingdom (3:12-30)

Guilt, honor and gentleness:

the attitude and actions of David point us to the good and gentle King to come (3:31-39)
