Sermon Notes

Bethlehem's Unseen Battle - The Violent Nativity

Revelation 12:1-12

Eugene Peterson says this about Revelation 12: "This is not the nativity story we grew up with, but it is the nativity story all the same". The birth of Jesus was a war-time birth. We don't see this reality depicted in the quiet peaceful scenes of our Christmas nativities where it seems "all is calm, all is bright".

Some commentators refer to Revelation 12 as an "apocalyptic Christmas story". In this violent nativity, there is an expectant mother - a soon-to-be-born baby, a powerful evil dragon waits to devour that child. Instead of praising God and announcing, "peace on earth", heaven's angels are fighting a war against Satan and his angels. And while Revelation will end with the eternal destruction of the dragon, that inevitable end is delayed, and until then - because Satan knows his time is short - he rages against those "who keep the commandments of God and hold to the testimony of Jesus." (12:17)

In reality, what is unfolding in the birth of Christ is a spiritual battle. It is an all-out assault "not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the cosmic powers over this present darkness, against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly places" (Eph 6:12). "The incarnation of the Son was nothing less than a declaration of war on Satan and his demonic forces…heaven was anything but peaceful when the Son was born, lived, died, rose, and was caught up to heaven in ascension and exaltation." D. Akin
