## Worship Guide for March 17, 2024

### Sermon Notes

#### Full Atonement, Can it Be?

2 Samuel 21:1-14 (pew Bible pgs. 273-274)

Chapters 21 through 24 of second Samuel form an epilogue of the books of Samuel. They feel like an add-on because they're not chronologically arranged. But they're not just stories the author decided to throw in at the end. These chapters serve as a summery of David's reign as King. They form the literary device that we've seen before in first and second Samuel - a chiasm.

Our passage today shows us the character of God, how serious He takes sin, and the massive cost for atonement. Our response should be a healthy fear of God, a right view of and response to sin, and an overwhelming appreciation for the price that was paid by our Savior for our salvation.

- 1. God is a Covenant Keeping God
  - a. The cause of the famine is sin
  - b. Breaking Covenant results in God's wrath
  - c. The contrast of a Covenant keeping King vs. a Covenant Breaking King
- 2. God is Just
  - a. Sin requires Justice
  - b. Justice requires Atonement
- 3. God is Merciful
- 4. God's justice is satisfied and His mercy is poured out at the cross

Jesus is the King who is able to save us from sin and the righteous wrath of God

Jesus is the atoning sacrifice
