Sermon Notes

Kingdom Perspective When It Matters the Most

2 Samuel 23:1-7 (pew Bible pgs. 275-276)

In this passage, David is looking back over his life through the lens of God's Word and His promises. Despite his sin and failures, David still has a covenant relationship with the Lord. He is still a man after God's own heart. And David is aware that his life and his Reign as Israel's King is a part of God's plan that's going somewhere, somewhere wonderful and amazing and beautiful. There's anticipation. David is at the end of his life, but he is hopeful. He is anticipating a divine resolution in the future. It's coming. He knows it's coming. How does he know it's coming? Because God said it!

"Moreover, the LORD declares to you that the LORD will make you a house. And your house and your kingdom shall be made sure forever before me. Your throne shall be established forever."

2 Samuel 7:11,16

When you come to the end of your life, it's really important to know some key things.

- I. King David knows who he is and whose Kingdom it is. He sees every part of his identity in relation to God.
- II. King David knows What (Who) matters God and HIS Word.
 These are David's last words to His people. But he knows they don't need his last words. They need to hear from GOD.
- III. King David knows the Hope of the promise of the GREATER KING
 - 1. The Promised King will reign in Righteousness
 - 2. The Promised King will bring Salvation
 - 3. The Promised King will bring Judgement
