Sermon Notes

Open Our Eyes, Lord

2 Kings 6:8-23 (pew Bible pg. 312)

Faith is not wishful thinking—it is seeing the unseen reality of God. Hebrews 11:1 tells us that faith is the assurance of things hoped for and the conviction of things not seen, and verse 6 reminds us that without faith it is impossible to please God. In 2 Kings 6, two men face the same situation—one is overwhelmed by what he sees, the other is confident in what he knows: God is always with and for His people. This passage shows us the difference between spiritual blindness and spiritual sight, and why we must pray, "Lord, open our eyes."

1. Spiritual blindness opposes God's purposes...

Spiritual sight sees that God is actively protecting His people—He is FOR them.

2. Spiritual blindness produces fear...

Spiritual sight sees God's presence—He is WITH them.

3. Spiritual blindness leads to reckless action...

Spiritual sight sees God's heart and provision of mercy and peace—He is FOR them, even toward enemies.
